# PCA Club Racing Traqgear Coolshirt West Coast Series storms towards thrilling conclusion next month at Buttonwillow

**Columbia MD**—The eyes of the Porsche motorsport world were on Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca last month for Rennsport Reunion V, but PCA's Traqgear Coolshirt West Coast series has been red hot at Laguna and other tracks throughout California and the West Coast during the entire the 2015 season.

Some class leaders through this month's races at Miller, leading into the series finale at Buttonwillow are as follows:

In GTB1, John Hua holds a small lead over Rodrigo Sales in the tightly contested class. The class championship could go either way dependent upon the outcome at Buttonwillow next month. In SP1, Randy Bergum, who sits in second place in the National Championship chase, holds a commanding lead, having showcased fast, clean, and consistent driving throughout the year. It's a similar story in SP911, where Robert Murillo holds both the Traqgear Coolshirt West Coast series championship lead, in addition to the PCA National Championship lead. Behind Murillo, Martin Braun and Andy Simpkinson are in a dogfight for second place, separated by 3 points. With four other drivers within 10 points of the final podium spot, both will need to be on their game to lock down the final podium positions. SPB is another hotly contested class with Tryve Isaacson holding the series lead. Just 9 points behind him is Scott Fisher, who maintains the slimmest of margins — a single point lead — over Doug Boccignone. Series registrar extraordinaire Andrew Forrest is positioned just a mere 6 points out of the final podium position should someone falter. The Traqgear Coolshirt West Coast series plays host to some of the most competitive GT class drivers in the country. This is evident in both GT3 and GT4 classes where Tom Weber and Jerry Hoffman both currently hold leads and sit in position for National Championship podium finishes. Behind them in their respective classes the competition doesn't let up, with a trio of drivers within second-place holder Dan Carusillo in the GT4 class.


